Other dinner reservations can be made by calling 922-5757 by Monday, **November 19th**.

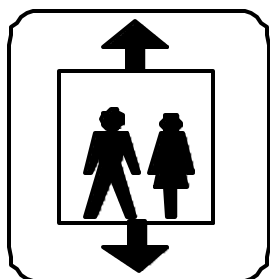

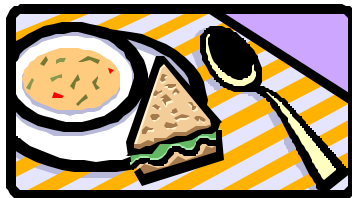

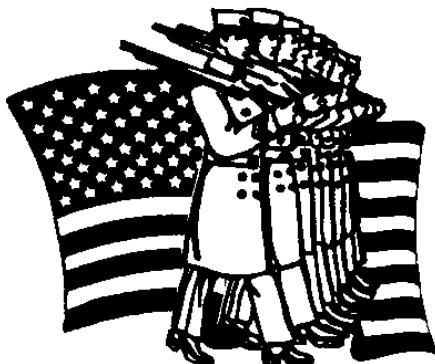

Elks Veterans Remembrance Month

SEPTEMBER 11TH, 2001 A DAY WE WILL ALWAYS REMEMBER

We have all been asked at different times the simple question of “where were you when _____” You fill in the blank. Where were you the day that Pearl Harbor was attacked, the day President Kennedy was shot, the day the World Trade Centers were blown up. Most of the times when these events occurred, we heard about them on the radio or television or read about them in the paper. These events always happen somewhere else and always to someone else. But, what if...

If I knew it would be the last time
I would be there to share your day,
Well, I'm sure you'll have many more
So I can just let this one slip away.

So if you're waiting for tomorrow,

HOUSE SUPPORTS POWs SEEKING COMPENSATION FROM JAPANESE COMPANIES FOR WWII ATROCITIES.

The House has passed legislation endorsing efforts by former prisoners of war to pursue a class action civil suit against the Japanese for indignities suffered during World War II. The legislation, an amendment to an appropriations bill, bars the U.S. Government from opposing lawsuits filed under a newly enacted California statute.

A group of veterans who survived the Bataan Death March and other Japanese atrocities charge they were forced to become slave labor for Japanese companies, working 12-hour days on meager rations of rice and water. They are seeking damages from Mitsui, Nippon Steel and other Japanese companies that owned the mines and industries involved.

The U.S. Government and the Japanese firms say the veterans were compensated in the years immediately following the war. They point to a clause in the San Francisco Peace Treaty that ended World War II that cuts off further claims. But the former POWs say a most-favored-nation clause in the treaty makes them eligible to sue. They claim that 11 other nations enjoy such an advantage.

The House vote was 395-33. Rep. Michael Honda (D-CA) and Rep. Dana Rohrabacher (R-CA) have introduced another measure that seeks a permanent ban on U.S. intervention in the state lawsuits. That bill has 150 cosponsors.

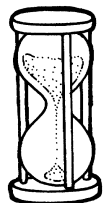

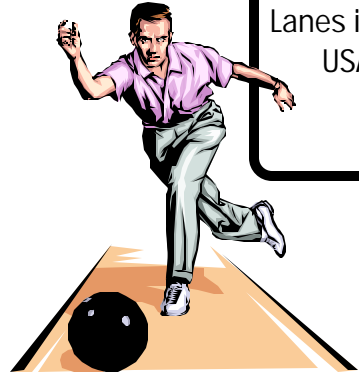

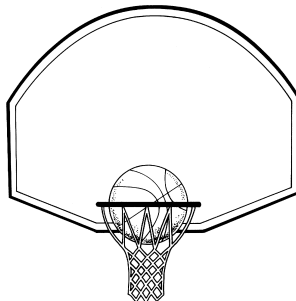
HOOP SHOOT VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

ELKS MEMBERSHIP CARDS TO SERVE AS ORGAN-DONOR AUTHORIZATION

Starting in 2003, members of the Elks can check an organ-donor option on the back of their membership cards. Meanwhile, Lodges will be raising awareness about organ donations in their communities.

Their action is a response to a request from Tommy Thompson, Secretary of Health and Human Services and the head of the Nation's largest department of government, to enlist in his "workplace partnership for life," an initiative to increase public support for organ donations.

"You are the first national fraternal organization to join the partnership, again demonstrating the kind of leadership we see from Elks nationwide," said Thompson, a member of the Madison, Wisconsin Lodge and featured speaker at the Grand Lodge Convention in Philadelphia.

Thompson noted the desperate need for leadership in getting the message out, because organ donations mean saving lives. More than 76,000 Americans are on the waiting list for organs, he said, and the number grows by more than 300 people each month. Each day 15 people die while on the waiting list.

Medical technology has evolved to permit the successful transplantation of hearts, kidneys, pancreas, lungs, liver and intestines. Also helping to save lives is donated tissue-the cornea, skin, bone marrow, heart valves, and connective tissue.

In coming weeks, the Government Relations Committees of State Associations and Lodges will be receiving additional information about organ donations and ideas for implementing information programs in your communities.
