Dear Members & Friends

Winter is finally over (I hope), the snow birds are back, the trees are budding out and the grass will soon be ready to mow. May will be a busy month for the Lodge. The first weekend is the Wisconsin Elks Association Spring Convention in Wausau. Monday May 6, is the Youth Activities Annual Banquet. Saturday May 11, we will have a Elks Balloon Party. Sunday May 19, will be the Elks Charities Raffle, Monday May 27, Memorial Day Parade (come see the Elks float in the parade).

At the Youth Activities Banquet we will award the scholarships to this years recipients and will honor a number of young men that have achieved the rank of Eagle Scout. Last year the Wisconsin Elks Association scholarship program awarded \$299,000.00.

Many times members ask, "How can I donate to the Elks Scholarship program?" The Grand Lodge Scholarship program is financed through the Elks National Foundation. You can be a member of the National Foundation (ENF) for a minimum \$10.00 donation per year, for a \$100.00 donation you will receive a silver, red and blue ENF Pin. For a \$1,000.00 you will receive a gold pin with a diamond and a framed certificate. Donations of any amount are welcome when you reach the levels listed above you will receive the appropriate recognition pin. All donations are recognized on the boards in the lodge room. This year Wisconsin received back from the ENF just under \$2.00 for every dollar sent in. The money donated is never used; only the interest is used for the Elks youth and Veterans programs. The Lodge chairman of the ENF this year is Don Behnke and he is working on bringing the boards up to date.

The Wisconsin Elks Association has the Wisconsin Elks Benevolent Fund. You can be a member of this fund for a \$3.00 minimum donation. With a \$100.00, \$500.00 or \$1,000.00 donation you will receive a pin from the Wisconsin Elks Benevolent Fund. This Fund supports the state scholarship program along with all the other state programs; Camp Waubeek, Hoop Shoot, Soccer Shoot, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Americanism (The Elks want to see a Flag in every class room), and Veterans.

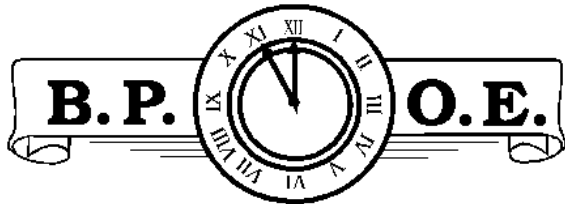

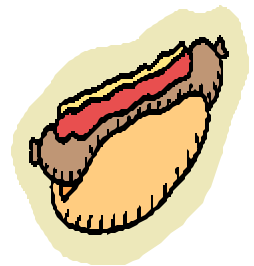

Special thanks go out to Peggy Schroeder who, on April 4th, worked her third bingo and earned her invitation to the Bingo Workers Party. Congratulations Peggy!!!

However, it is my unfortunate duty to announce that the Bingo program is in a state of emergency. We are running short of Team Leaders for this year. I have done practically everything in my power to keep the program running smoothly, but I am not able to be the Team Leader for every session this year. Without the support of members to become Team Leaders, the Bingo program will die.

Bingo is a very important part of our Order. Ben Go dlewski, the Bingo Chairman for Milwaukee Lodge 46, stated it best when he said: "**B.P.O.E. Bingo Pays Our Expenses.**" He couldn't be more right. Without Bingo, our scholarships will not be as large. Without Bingo, Boy and Girl Scouts that we have donated to in the past will not be able to rely on us for donations. Without Bingo, most other charitable projects will have to be reduced or even removed or from our agenda.

Last year, Bingo accounted for \$12,673.64 in profit. Once we move back here on June 6, we will increase our profit by \$200 every night from not having to pay rent to the Masonic Center. That gives us a projected profit of \$16,500 for this year. This does not include the money brought in from raffle ticket and pull tab sales. Also, we will be bringing money to the club through the sale of food and beverages.

A bingo session takes roughly 5 hours a night. We hold 2 sessions a month. This calculates out to 10 hours a month or 120 hours a year. Knowing that everybody can grasp the concept of a 40 hour work week, that equates a year of Bingo sessions to 3 work weeks. It doesn't take a rocket scientist to realize that it would be foolish to pass up the opportunity to work for three weeks with a turnaround profit of \$16,500...but that's what we are doing.

If the Bingo program would die, we would have to come up with some way to make that \$16,500 back, or cut that \$16,500 from our yearly budget. One way is to raise membership dues. However, if that were the case, dues would have to be raised by \$20 to \$25 per member.

Members, in order to save the Bingo program (and in essence, the Lodge), as Chairman of the Bingo Committee, I am issuing a challenge to everybody. I challenge you to find a Team Leader for any Bingo session. The Team Leader is responsible for putting together a group of no more than 10 or so people to work bingo, and settle any disputes or questions during a bingo session. In the absence of the Chairman, the Team Leader has TOTAL AUTHORITY over the bingo operations of that session. This person can be you, your spouse, a neighbor, or a friend...it doesn't matter. Bingo needs Team Leaders now, or the program will die. The Bingo Board is located at the Club...all you need to do is sign up, call me at (262) 472-9307, or e-mail the Bingo Committee at elksbingo@hotmail.com.

Bingo needs everybody's help. As a Lodge, we can't let this money-maker die.

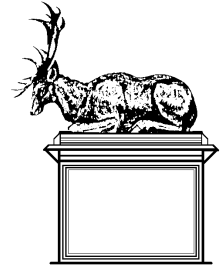

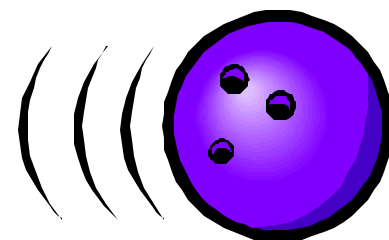

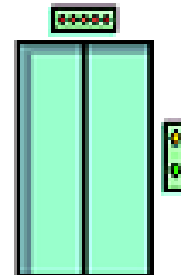

Wow, I can't believe it is my final letter to you as your President. The past year has gone by so fast; which to me means it has been a very good year.

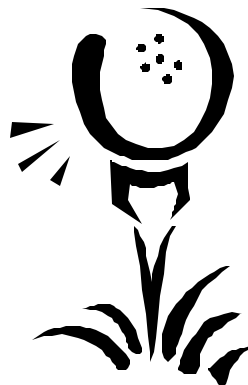
