From the Archives:

Historic Fond du Lac, Events of January

Some of these facts are from public records, most of them were found from the newspapers on microfilm in the Fond du Lac Public Library.

5th, 1850, King Camp Gillette, inventor of the safety razor, born in FDL.

10th, 1855, Bank of Fond du Lac organized. Later renamed the First National bank.

12th, 1850, The Morse Telegraph was in operation here.

13th, 1847, "Friends of Freedom" an anti-slavery group to meet in the courthouse.

28th, 1849, A meeting was held to organize for protection against horse-thieves and burglars.

4th, 1896, Giddings & Lewis incorporated with \$68,000 stock value. Makes saw-mill machinery.

12th, 1905, Cost per each school child in Fond du Lac- \$71.75. \$16.49 goes to maintain buildings.

13th, 1896, Because of the long cold spell, jails are filled with tramps.

18th, 1898, Fond du lac, Tent and Awning is a new industry here.

10th, 1904, Saloon on runners has been set up in the middle of Lake Winnebago.

10th, 1951, South hills Country Club organized for "tennis, golf and other sports".

21, 1921, Pastors in Fond du Lac, want women to abandon short skirts and high heels.

29th, 1921, A seven hundred pound, weight of the courthouse clock fell through the roof to the circuit court room.

30th, 1924, KFIZ has been heard in NY, Mass, and Va.

31st, 1928, Knute Rockne, Famous Norte Dame football coach spoke in Fond du lac.


