Greetings, Fellow Elks,

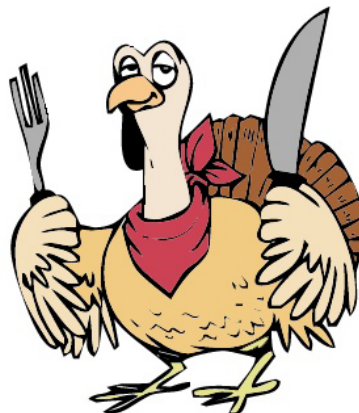
